The Developer Threat – the Valley in peril

The last Newsletter urged you to respond to the Greater Norwich Local Plan (GNLP) consultation. You now have an extra week in which to do so. The deadline for comments has been extended to Thursday 22nd March at 1700; but please act ASAP.

Developers and Landowners are applying for a number of sites that are, all or part in the "protected" green space in the Yare Valley. The number is now in double figures— and they can still add more! Their applications show a total disregard of the benefits of the existing green space of the Valley to the community. It also has something to say about the Growth Options Consultation Document, and Question 13 on a possible Green Belt.

These developments must be stopped if we are to continue to enjoy the Yare Valley as a place for wildlife and informal recreation. Many people are quite unaware of the consultation is taking place, and of the threat to the Valley. We must change this if we are to successfully defend the Valley. Developer has another try at Keswick for "Super Triangle" development

The Yare Valley Society has responded to the re-submission of a planning application for an employment zone in the Keswick Triangle. The application goes far beyond the area designated in the local plan for developing and seeks to increase the range of industrial activity permitted on the site.

Progress towards construction of the Colney Footbridge

South Norfolk District Council are seeking a Compulsory Purchase Order for a strip of land in Colney to enable them to complete the River Yare Pedestrian bridge linking a Colney bridleway from the Watton Road (B1108) with Bowthorpe South Park. Watch this space.

McCarthy and Stone and the Strawberry Field – a deal is close!

A condition of the McCarthy and Stone Development was that the Strawberry Field between Bartram Mowers and the Donkey Sanctuary would be available for public access.

The YVS committee understands that the developer and the Council are now close to a "106 agreement", and there are encouraging signs that attention has been given to YVS suggestions.
