Some of the people who were successful in changing the City's Local Plan proposals for a high tech centre at Earlham Hall and Park have recently formed this group to try to ensure a suitable future use for the Hall and its environs after the UEA Law School ceases to renew its lease in 2005.

The archives comprise rare botanical books covering five centuries; letters, including from Charles Darwin; scientific notebooks and research records from the early 20th century; a large photographic collection; and botanical illustrations from early woodcuts to modern printing. Development proposal on UEA farm site

Thank you to all those who wrote to the City about this proposal. The City sent the proposal back to UEA for it to consider alternative sites or modifications of the

proposed plan. A revised scheme has now been submitted for the same site with the buildings in different positions but still, of course, infringing on land protected by the City's river valley policy from inappropriate development such as this. The application will be considered by the City's planning committee on 19 September 2002. Previous letters objecting to the development in principle will be taken into account.

New South Norfolk Local Plan

This is likely to become South Norfolk's adopted Plan shortly. The development of Colney Hall and grounds as Research Park which we so vigorously opposed, will unfortunately be included in it. We trust that the development will be as sympathetic to the valley as was being suggested by the developer at the Inquiry into the proposal.

Norwich Replacement Local Plan – Second Deposit Version

The Second Deposit version of the Local Plan has just been published and will be subject to a short period for formal representations. It may be seen at City Hall. At this stage it is only possible to make comments about changes to the First Deposit version; it is not possible to make comments about policies or proposals that have not been changed. Needless to say we shall look at it carefully for any changes that have been made to the City's proposals for the valley, particularly between Bowthorpe and Harford bridge.


We can report that Bartram Mowers' request that their site in Bluebell Road should be considered for housing or high technology industry has not been included in the Second Deposit version.
